- The SCEGGS Music Eisteddfod is a competition open to all musicians currently taking private lessons, inside or outside of school.
- Entry into the Eisteddfod is FREE.
- All Elective Music students are preparing for participation.

#### **Heats**

- Heats will be held in Weeks 7 and 8 during regular Music class lessons for Primary students, Year 7 students and Elective Music students.
- All other heats will be held during regular class lesson time.
- Students will perform for the external, specialist adjudicator in a music studio there is no audience.
- Due to timetabling restrictions, adjudicators do not provide written reports or any other feedback.
- The adjudicator's decision is final, and no discussion will be entered in to.
- TIME LIMIT: 5 MINUTES

#### **Highlights Concerts**

- Adjudicators select between 15-20 performers to perform at each Highlights concert (Primary & Secondary).
- Primary Highlights concert: Wednesday 24 March at 4:00pm
  Secondary Highlights concert: Tuesday 16 March at 5:00pm
- A variety of awards are made at these concerts:
  - 1. Outstanding Musician of the Primary School/Secondary School
  - 2. Wran Prize for Up and Coming Vocalist (Secondary only)
  - 3. Acknowledgement Awards
- The adjudicator's decision is final, and no discussion will be entered in to.

#### **Vocal Heats: Wran Prize for Up and Coming Vocalist**

- Vocalists from the Secondary school are eligible for this award, which will be made in association with participation in the SCEGGS Eisteddfod.
- The vocal section is judged separately by a specialist vocal adjudicator.
- Outstanding performers will be selected by the adjudicator to compete for the award at the Secondary Eisteddfod Highlights Concert.

#### **Secondary Vocalists:**

- May choose to present songs of any style (e.g.: art music, musical theatre, jazz standards, contemporary popular styles).
- Should limit the length of the song to a structure of *no more than 2 verses, 2 choruses and a coda.*
- May include a well-prepared improvised break but it must not unnecessarily extend the length of the song.

#### **Primary Vocalists:**

- Are advised to select short pieces suited to the young developing voice, which will enable them to demonstrate clarity of vocal tone and a musical approach to expression.
- Are strongly recommended to choose folk, character, or other simple songs suited to young voices.
- <u>Must discuss their application with Mrs Cleworth or Ms Lanneke Jones before</u> entering if they do not have voice lessons.

#### **Piano Accompaniment**

- This may be provided for all instrumental and vocal heats if the student brings the appropriate music.
- It is the responsibility of the performer to bring their accompaniment on the day of their heat.
- No rehearsals are available prior to the Eisteddfod heats due to the volume of performers.
- Vocal entrants <u>must</u> provide a clearly marked, edited version of a print copy of the piano accompaniment, in the correct key.
- All sheet music must be in a display folder no loose sheets!
