

The Margot Anthony (Budd) Beyond the Curriculum Music Awards

The Margot Anthony (Budd) *Beyond the Curriculum* Music Award will be awarded annually to two students. The award consists of a monetary amount awarded annually for students in Years 8 to 11, who study Elective Music. The Award is to be used by the student to support their continued involvement in musical activities, which serve to facilitate the development of their musical potential.

General Guidelines

- This award is awarded by the Head of School.
- There will be two awards awarded every year.
- This is an Award that is awarded annually to a student who is an experienced young musician entering the Year 8, 9,10 or 11 Elective Music program.
- Students must demonstrate a proven record of music learning through formal tuition, and successful music examination results over a number of years, in at least one area of instrumental/vocal expertise.
- Students will be able to demonstrate a developing interest in the field through involvement with school-based co-curricular music ensembles.
- Students will be able to demonstrate a developing interest in the field through self-initiated music-related activities, undertaken in their own time (e.g., youth orchestra, composition, learning additional instruments for interest, attending concerts for enjoyment, exploring diverse repertoire styles, attending 'one-off' lessons or masterclasses with guest teachers, attending National Music Camp).
- The maximum amount awarded is \$1,500.00 per student per year.

The award may be used by the student to support any of the following:

- a weekly involvement with a special music education program (e.g., Sydney Children's Choir).
- participation in a 'one-off' special musical event, master class or workshop (e.g., Gondwana, String Teachers' Association, Australian Composition Workshop).
- travel to attend a festival or concert event (e.g., Womad Festival, tour with a youth orchestra).
- undertake classes for a short period in a specialist area (e.g., music composition).
- subscribe to a public concert series or attend 'on-off' concerts offering exposure to diverse music (e.g., chamber music, opera).
- towards the purchase or hire of a higher quality musical instrument.
- involvement with an identified, musically enriching experience.

Conditions of acceptance.

- An undertaking by the student to continue to make contributions to the school's music education program through regular involvement with music-related activities.
- An undertaking by the student to seek and became involved with a music education provision, offered outside the school, for the express purposes of facilitating the development of her musical potential.

Application Process.

- Complete and return to attached Application to **Head of School** by **Monday 1 March 2021 (Week 6)**.
- Attached the required supporting statements.
